

Waterfront and Health Assistant Program Director

Minimum age 21, previous camping experience preferred, lifeguard history required

As the Waterfront and Health APD, you would

- Be the head lifeguard thus organizing any lifeguard in-services, pulling aside and talking with other lifeguards about their job performance, making sure all lifeguards are 100% comfortable with their duties
- Be responsible for calling safety shots in terms of boating days, conducting swimming test guidelines, and beach rules
- Be responsible for medicines that campers come with. At registration, the parents will leave medicine with you/us. You would be responsible for getting that medicine to those campers at the time he or she needs the medicine
- Record medicines that are taken outside of the 'scheduled' time given at registration
- Keep medicines at all times in a safe place, but also where other counselors can reach meds if needed
- Be on call 24/7 as the go-to-injury person. If a camper or counselor is injured, he or she will be sent to you, and you will exam him or her to your best ability and determine if more assistance is required
- Organize and maintain a decent area to treat wounds, health issues, or other issues concerning or related to health

As an APD you would

- focus on counselors
- be excellent role models for staff
- be involved with all worships
- encourage positive behavior to counselors and campers alike
- help with KP
- have activities during the day/evening
- help put fire out
- work with other APDs to plan the best camping experience
- Help with canteen
- Participate in daily activities

There will be an APD leadership training before staff training. More details about when this training would be are included in the contract. Other expectations will be discussed and formed then with the other APDs.
